### **Sample for Nominating Distinguished Alumni Award for Advancement in Career**

#### **1. Nominee's Type of Employment**

Jacob Wentworth, Ph.D., is executive vice president and president of James-Metz Research Institute (MJRI), the pharmaceutical research arm of Horace-Dunn Corporation. Wentworth is responsible for all aspects of MJRI, including heading up the Leadership Board (LB). The LB guides the strategic direction of product development programs and oversees the movement of projects through the development, registration and launch phases.

#### **2. Positions achieved in this employment and others.**
